UNPACKING

TLING

NOTE.-Use only Edison Diamond Oil

On the phonograph when received, and occasionally (about once a month) when in use.
 To oil phonograph, remove the top grille (T.G.) and apply if at all the points listed below:

(a) All bearings in mechanism beneath the top plate (T.P.).

(b) The two oil-holes in top of gear cover (G.C.).

(d) Along reproducer carriage slide rod (S.R.).

3. Replace the top grills.

4. To par in the trout grille (F.U.) insert one edge of gril to upper slot at front opening of cabinet, jush up grille as far as all go and allow lower edge to drop into its slot. NOTE.—The illustration herein shows the Amberola 30 cylind properaph, but those parts referred to in these instructions will.

raph fully.

Raise the reproducer by means of the lift lever (L.L.) an gain lift the reproducer carriage (R.C.) to extreme left.

Shide record (title end out) onto cylinder (C.) until it fit lightly.

4. Start phonograph by pushing to left the operating lever (O.L.).
5. Side reproducer (R. J. to right until the diamond point comes just within the left end of the grooved or playing area of the record.
6. Lower reproducer conto record by training down the reproduced to the record of the record of the reproducer and the reproducer and reproducer producer and the producer.
7. When record is finished, raise reproducer and stop phonograph.

7. When record is finished, raise reproducer and stop phono graph, by pushing operating lever (O.L.) to right.
8. Shife reproducer about half way toward left end of cylinder and remove record by pushing gently but firmly against its inside end.
9. To play another record, rewind phonograph and proceed as above.

 Rewinding after each record is not necessary, but will be found more convenient than to allow phonograph to run down befor rewinding.

SPEED ADJUSTMENT

1. Be sure the phonograph rests upon a steady and level surface.
